Guidelines For Dealing With The Police On A Traffic Stop Relax.

Be in the right mental state for the encounter. Do not presume the police stopped you because they are picking on you.

If weather permits roll down all your windows, especially if they are tinted.

If it is dark, turn on the dome light.

Place your hands on the wheel and have any passengers place theirs on the dash or headrests in front of them.

Once the officer realizes you are not a threat, they will most likely tell you to relax and roll up your windows.

You can set the tone for the encounter.

Be polite.

Feel free to converse with the officer and realize that you do not have to answer any questions you feel may incriminate you.

You will have to communicate with the officer and comply with requests to produce your license, insurance, rental contract, etc...

If you feel any actions the officer has taken are inappropriate. You can address it with their supervisor afterwards.

In the event you get a ticket and feel you were not violating any traffic laws, follow the instructions on the back of the ticket, and/or meet with a clerk at the courthouse to pursue a case.

Always remember your first court appearance do not start on the side of the road at that moment it only takes place in the courthouse.
